This program provides assistance to survivors of domestic/partner abuse, child abuse and neglect, elder abuse, and all other forms of domestic violence, including, but not limited to, emotional, financial, and physical.

Sexual Assault Program

This program provides assistance to adult and child survivors of sexual abuse and/or assault, adult survivors of childhood abuse or harassment, and significant others of survivors, including partners, children, family members, and friends.

Prevention Education/Training

Victim Services staff are ready to provide the following: advocacy, counseling, emergency services, prevention education, and professional training. **We celebrate diversity and want to serve everyone who needs us.**

Free Counseling

Counseling can provide a safe space for you to explore your feelings, regain a sense of control and order in your life, and find hope in the future.

Free Advocacy

Our advocates serve as a personal link for the survivor to hospital, law enforcement, and criminal justice staff. Your advocate will help you understand your choices and rights.

Free Emergency Services

Victim Services can provide emergency transportation, clothing, and food for survivors and their families. The Domestic Violence Program also offers temporary emergency safe shelter.
